

81. *Duocameratus* Lees (2007)

Type species: *Duocameratus leariae* gen. et sp. nov.

Derivation of name: From the Latin '*duo*', meaning two, '*camera*', meaning 'vaulted chamber' and '*atus*', meaning 'like', referring to the double-chambered, vaulted nature of the holococcolith in side view.

Diagnosis: In side view, delicate-looking, cavate, polygonal holococcoliths with thin rims and proximal plates. A central septum divides the cavity into two. Where the septum meets the external structure, the joints are thickened and appear bright in most orientations.
